

# PE & Sport Premium Report

## September 2015



### What is the PE & Sport Premium?

The PE and Sport Premium is a grant designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. £450 million was set aside for the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016 and is allocated based on pupil numbers in Year 3 – 6.

In most cases, the amount of funding is determined by the number of pupils in the school using data from the January 2015 school census.

- Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £500 per pupil.
- Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best of way using of the money.

For example, schools can use their funding to:

- Hire specialist PE teachers
- Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- Provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs
- Run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)
- Run sports activities with other schools.

### How much Sport Premium has the school received?

Funding received for the year April 2013 - March 2014:	<b>£9,078</b>

### How has the school used the Sport Premium?

The school's Sport Premium expenditure is reported at the end of the academic year; however the school made the decision to hold back part of the funding and allocate this to two major projects completed last year, which are shown in the expenditure table below:

### What has been the impact of the Sport Premium at Shottermill Junior School?

The impact of the swimming pool refurbishment, replacement changing rooms and high quality swimming training undertaken by all teaching staff has all helped to ensure the continuation of our commitment to provide swimming lessons to all children every year. The children have told us that they greatly enjoy learning to swim and the accelerated progress they make in the water, coupled with a chance to learn about water safety has a very positive outcome in this area of Physical Education.

The new all-weather pitch, which has only just been installed, is already providing an additional playing surface for PE lessons and specialist coaching to take place. The special surface is helping to ensure sports safety and a greater opportunity for outside PE lessons to take place.

Investment in Confederation Sporting Events over the past year has also provided all children with the opportunity to experience a range of different sports and competitive participation with other local schools. We believe this has a positive impact of developing children's love of sport.

Lastly, we are delighted that the funding has also provided important subject leadership development opportunities and as a result the school has been awarded the **Sainsbury's School Games Silver** award.

### How do we intend to spend the Sport Premium in the year ahead?

At Shottermill Junior School we believe PE & Sport both play an important role in developing children's self-awareness, team work, resilience and ability to refine new skills. Children should develop a good understanding of the skills, techniques and rules for competing in a number of sports as well as learn about the history of sport.

Our aim is that all children have equal access to developing in this area of the curriculum and Shottermill has recently reviewed our teaching and learning of PE in line with the New National Curriculum, which aims to ensure that all pupils:

- Develop competence to excel in a broad range of physical activities;
- Are physically active for sustained periods of time;
- Engage in competitive sports and activities;
- Lead healthy, active lives.

Actions for the year ahead	Expected Outcome / Impact
Release time for the PE Subject Leader to visit other schools and attend training opportunities.	The Subject Leader will develop in the role and have a greater understanding of the provision for Sports in other schools. This will result in clear action planning to raise the profile of the subject further and our performance at inter-school sports level.
Release time for the PE Subject Leader to monitor the quality of Sports provision at Shottermill and development of staff training needs.	The Subject Leader will have further understanding of the quality of PE provision as well as the impact of the Sports Funding resulting in further action planning of the year ahead. Staff will further develop their skills to be able to teach all aspects of PE confidently resulting in improved outcomes for children.
Targeted / subsidised coaching for pupils to develop in their chosen sport.	Opportunities will be explored to utilise the facilities (particularly the Dance Studio) and bring in coaches to provide targeted high quality coaching to pupils resulting in improved outcomes, particularly for G&T pupils.
Audit and purchasing of PE equipment and resources, including the purchase of brushes to clean footwear on entry to the school and all-weather pitch.	This will ensure that children always have access to high quality PE equipment which will in turn improve their skills development.
PE Subject Leader to further champion their subject at Shottermill Juniors.	Following on from this year's hard work to achieve Silver, we hope to achieve the <b>Sainsbury's School Games Gold award</b> .
