Solar Eclipse




Although it turned out to be a very overcast day, the children thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Solar Eclipse last week - via the online coverage on the BBC website.

A huge thank you to all those families who sponsored the children to complete a Maths test in aid of the FULL STOP campaign for the NSPCC.


I know you will all agree that the work of the NSPCC is invaluable to support children who are at risk of harm in the UK.

Thank you to Mandy, who came in to deliver a great assembly on the work of the NSPCC, explaining how children can keep themselves safe and where to seek help if they need to.





Kandinsky pictures by Year 6


Quiz Night




Improved handwriting and presentation of work


Well done to Charlie Gosbee who has made a great deal of progress with his handwriting so far this term, as can be seen in the picture:
