Examples: I, me, he, she, herself, you 	<p>coordinating conjunction a word that links two simple sentences that make sense on their own. e.g. and, but, so, for, yet</p>	<p>cohesion When it is clear how different parts of a text fit together. This is achieved by grouping sentences in paragraphs, using words and phrases to link ideas</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • adverbial a word or phrase which gives more information about a verb or about a clause, usually describing how/when/where/how often 	<p>parenthesis it is the extra information contained inside brackets, commas or dashes. If you take out the word or phrase between the two commas, dashes or brackets, the sentence should still make sense on its own</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • relative pronoun introduce more information about the noun. Examples include: that, who, whom
<p>relative clause These add additional information to a sentence. They come after the noun and start with a pronoun such as who, whom, which, that.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • possessive pronoun tell you who something belongs to. Examples include: mine, yours, his, hers, ours 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • modal verb used to express possibility, certainty, ability or obligation. They are used to make verb phrases. Examples include: might, will, shall,
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • subordinating conjunction a word that introduces a subordinate clause, joining it to the main clause. e.g. after, although, as, because, even though, if. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • subordinate clause A clause with a group of words that has both a subject and a verb but cannot stand alone in a sentence. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • inverted commas <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The punctuation that goes around speech
