Teachers



In the morning your teacher will take the register and check whether you are lunch option 1, 2, or 3. You will be able to pre-order at home.




- If the ball goes over the fence ask a grown up to get it for you.




House points and Warnings


PE


We sometimes go to the field for games. If it rains we use the hall. You will need to bring your named trainers, as well as a named school PE kit everyday.



Swimming


In the summer, we swim in the school swimming pool. The water is heated and we even swim if it is raining!




Library
