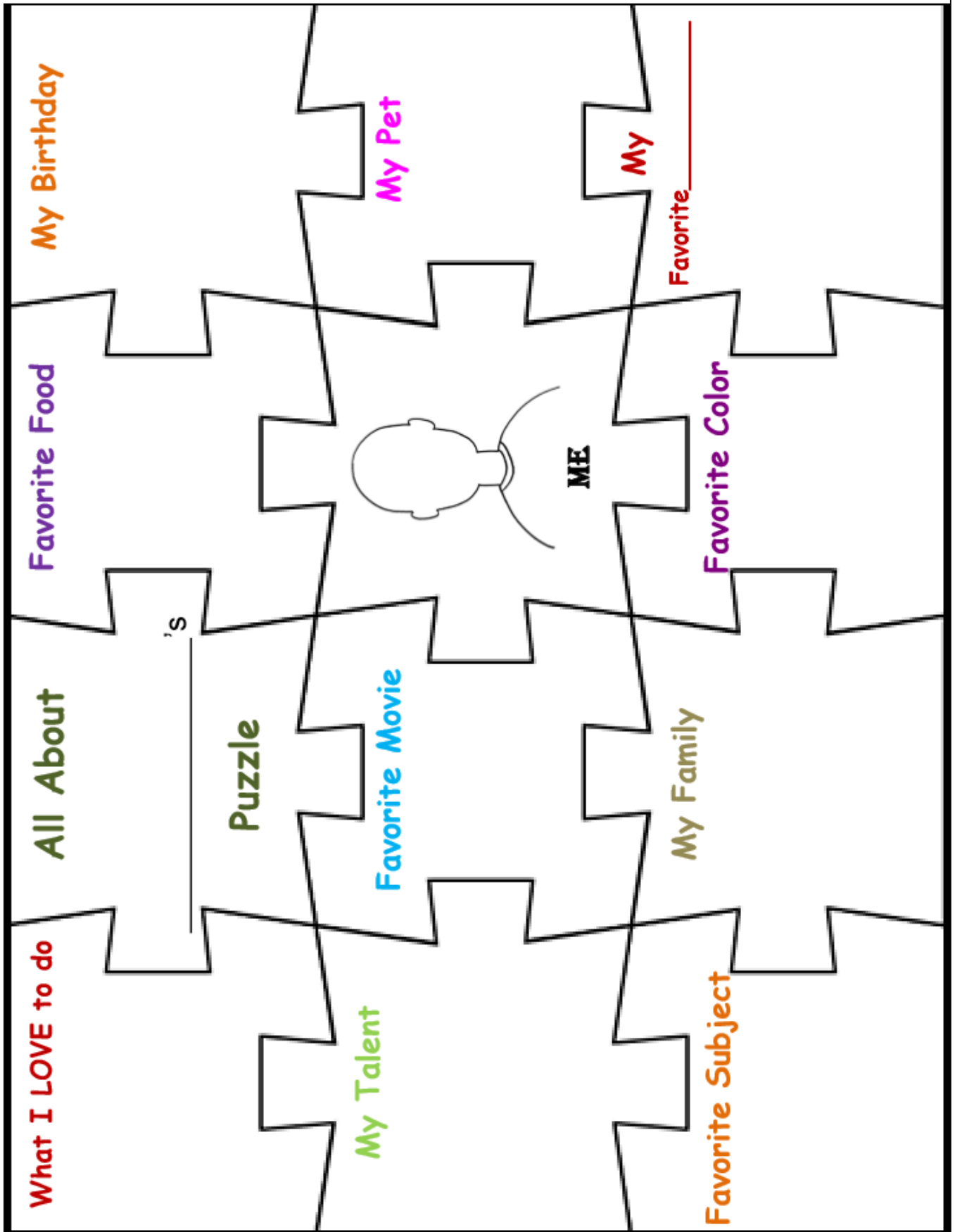

Paragraph 4 What do you already know about Year 6? What would you like to know?
Closing paragraph
