Dear Parents,

Welcome back to Shottermill and Year 4, where we have many stimulating and fun filled activities planned for the term ahead! The following newsletter is aimed at providing some useful reminders for how you can support your child's learning and development whilst they are in Year 4.

Class Rules:

We have created the following class agreement to help us create a positive learning environment in Year 4:

In 4H we agree it is important to:

- Treat other people how you would like to be treated.
- Be kind and respect other people's disabilities, opinions, feelings and property.
- Be polite, take turns to talk and listen when someone else is talking.
- Share ideas and help others develop their ideas.
- Let other children get on with their work, without distracting or copying them.
- When working in a group making sure that everyone feels valued, included and is doing something useful.

In 4N we agree it is important to:

- Respect- ourselves, other people, our classroom, school and community.
- Join in - include everyone , don't be afraid to make mistakes and give things a try.
- Help - help ourselves and each other if we are out of the Green Learning Zone.
- Safe - be safe and sensible in all areas of the school, continue to wash our hands regularly, sneeze and cough into tissues!

Being well prepared for school:

Children are welcome to bring a small, named pencil case to school with the following items: a whiteboard pen, a black pen, a pencil, a long ruler (non-bendy) some colouring pencils and a glue stick. Children should also remember to bring their homework, reading book and musical instruments if they currently receive tuition in school.

Children should come to school in their PE kit on the days that they have PE, which currently takes place as follows:

4H and 4N – Tuesday and Friday

As with all personal belongings, children's PE kits should be clearly labelled.

Homework:

The homework diary and any related sheets are available on the website each week. In addition to the homework set in the table below, children are expected to read to an adult for 10-15 minutes each night, which should be recorded in their Reading Diary.
