Dear Parents,

Happy New Year! Welcome back to the Spring Term, where we have many exciting things planned for the weeks ahead, including a Greek Day (with dressing up) together with a visit from our Greek specialist Michanos and our Year 3 assembly 1.3.24 @9.15am, which families are invited to. The following newsletter is aimed at providing some useful reminders for how you can support your child's learning and development, whilst they are in Year 3. Details of the key areas studied this term in each of the National Curriculum subjects can be found by downloading the **Spring Term Curriculum Overview**, which is available on the Curriculum and Class Information pages of the school website.

Being well prepared for school: Please ensure that the children continue to have the following items in their pencil cases: a whiteboard pen, 2-3 pencils, a sharpener, some colouring pencils, a ruler, and a glue stick. Please make sure all equipment is named. On a daily basis, the children should bring their **reading book and reading diary/ record to school to be checked regularly** and gain house points. Please also ensure a warm/ waterproof coat is with them, as we aim to go outside as much as possible.

On their PE day, the children need to come to school in the correct PE attire, ready for outside weather. PE currently takes place on:

- Tuesday and Thursday for 3G and 3N

As with all personal belongings, children's PE items should be clearly labelled.

Homework reminder: The homework diary and any related sheets are available on the Google Classroom each week. A paper copy of the Spring homework grid has been sent home. The weekly homework diary and spellings will be available on Google classroom, but if you need a paper copy, please let us know.

In addition to the homework set in the table below, children are expected to read to an adult for 10 minutes each night. This should be recorded in their Reading Diary by parents and summarised by the children. **We would also welcome any further adult volunteers to hear children read in school, please contact the office if you are able to help.**
