Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the Summer Term of 2024, where we have many exciting things planned for the weeks ahead! The following newsletter is aimed at providing some useful reminders for how you can support your child's learning and development whilst they are in Year 4.

Being well prepared for school:

Children are welcome to bring a small, named pencil case to school with the following items: a black pen, a pencil, a long ruler (non-bendy) some colouring pencils and a glue stick. Children should also remember to bring their reading book, reading diary, a named water bottle and a named school sun hat to school every day. As with all personal belongings, children's sweatshirts should be clearly labelled.

Children should come to school in their PE kit on the days that they have PE, which currently takes place as follows:

4H – Wednesday and Friday

4ZC - Monday and Wednesday

Swimming will start as soon as possible and we will send you a separate letter telling you about this and to notify you the days on which your child will be swimming.

Homework:

The homework diary and any related sheets are available on the website each week. In addition to the homework set in the table below, children are expected to read to an adult for 10-15 minutes each night, which should be recorded in their Reading Diary.
