Dear Team Year 3 Grown-ups,

Welcome back to the Summer Term of 2026, where we have many exciting things planned for the weeks ahead, including swimming as the weather improves! Details of the key areas studied this term in each of the National Curriculum subjects can be found on the **Summer Term Curriculum Overview**.

Being well prepared for school:

Children need to continue to restock their pencil cases with the following items: a whiteboard pen, a pencil, a long ruler (non-bendy), some colouring pencils and a glue stick. Each day children should bring their reading book and reading diary.

Children should also remember to come to school in their correct PE kit, with hair tied back and earrings removed. PE currently takes place on a Tuesday and Thursday for both classes. It is important that children remember their water bottles and sun protection everyday, this includes a SJS cap to be worn at outside playtimes and PE.

This should be recorded in their Reading Diary by parents and summarised by the children as we check daily.
