Class Rules:

Being well prepared for school:

Children are welcome to bring a small, named pencil case to school with the following items: a whiteboard pen, a black pen, a pencil, a long ruler (non-bendy) some colouring pencils and **glue sticks**. Children should also remember to bring their reading book and musical instruments if they currently receive tuition in school.

Children should come to school in their PE kit on the days that they have PE, which currently takes place as follows:

4W – Tuesday and Friday

4ZH – Wednesday and Friday

As with all personal belongings, children's PE kits should be clearly labelled.

Homework:

The homework diary, any related sheets and related information are available on Google Classroom each week. In addition to the homework set in the table below, children are expected to read to an adult for 10-15 minutes each night, which should be recorded in their Reading Diary. We would also welcome any further adult volunteers to hear children read in school, please contact the office if you are able to help.
