Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the Autumn Term of 2026, where we have many exciting activities planned for the weeks ahead! The following newsletter is aimed at providing some useful reminders for how you can support your child's learning and development whilst they are in Year 6.

Being well prepared for school:

Children should bring a small, named pencil case to school with the following items: a black pen, a blue biro, a pencil, scissors, a rubber, colouring pencils, sharpener, whiteboard pen and multiple glue sticks. Children should also remember to bring their reading book every day.

P.E. currently takes place on Monday and Tuesday for 6H and Tuesday and Thursday for 6W. On P.E. days, children need to wear their P.E. kit to school. As with all personal belongings, children's P.E. kits should be clearly labelled. We would like parents to write a letter if there is a medical reason why their child is unable to participate in P.E.

Homework:

The Homework Diary and any related sheets are available on Google Classroom (except for maths) each week. In addition to the homework set in the table below, children are expected to read to an adult for 15 minutes each night. Children should complete homework on Google Classroom or on paper and photograph this for Google Classroom. This and any 3D items should be photographed to upload on Google Classroom.
